Subject Specific Vocabulary

viaduct	A long bridge-like structure, typically a series of arches, carrying a road or railway across a valley or other low ground.
landscape	An area that can be viewed from one time from one place. A natural landscape is made up of areas such as mountains, hills and fields. A man-made landscape includes buildings and roads.
mill	A factory for manufacturing things such as paper, steel or textiles. A mill can also be equipped for grinding grain into flour.
human geography	The study of people and their communities, cultures, economies and interactions with the environment.
physical geography	The study of natural processes of the Earth e.g. climate
town	A populated area with fixed boundaries and a local government. Towns are usually bigger than villages but smaller than cities.
city	The largest type of settlement which usually includes hospitals, universities and a cathedral.
county	An area of the United Kingdom containing lots of towns and villages.
Ordnance Survey	A detailed map produced by the British or Irish government.
