- It has the largest population in the world, with over 1.3 billion people.



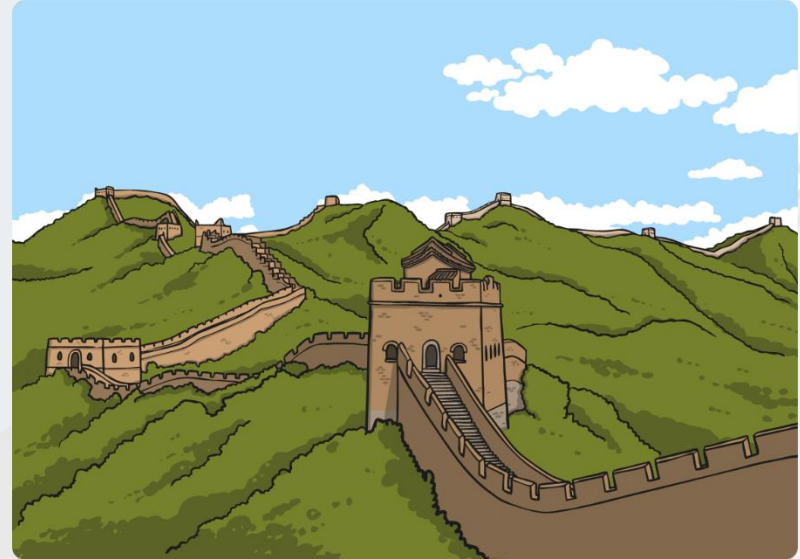
Beijing

- The date of Chinese New Year changes each year because it follows a very old calendar which is linked to the phases of the Moon.
- Chinese New Year is always in January or February.



Preparing for the New Year

- Chinese people spring clean their houses and gardens to sweep away any bad luck.
- Houses are decorated with paper scrolls and lanterns, with good luck messages on them.



New Year's Eve

- Families gather together and have a traditional meal of fish and chicken.
- In the north of China people eat dijiaozi – a steamed dumpling.
- In the south of China people eat nian gao – a sticky, sweet rice pudding.
- People stay up until midnight setting off fireworks to scare away evil spirits.



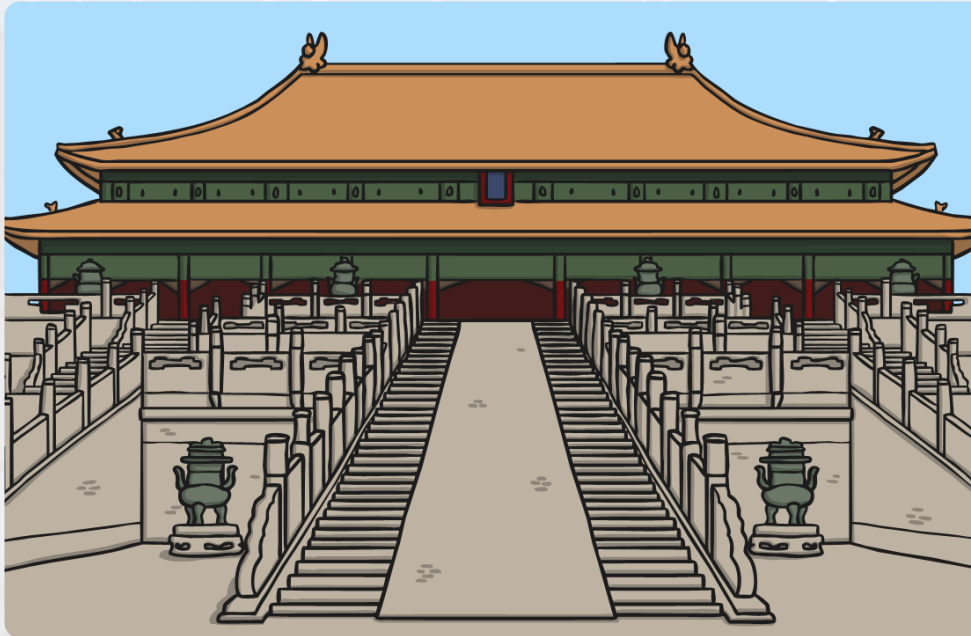
New Year's Day

- Children wake up to find red envelopes filled with money and sweets under their pillow.
- Every family member starts the day with brand new clothes from head to toe.
- Red is a very popular colour for clothes, as it is thought to be lucky!



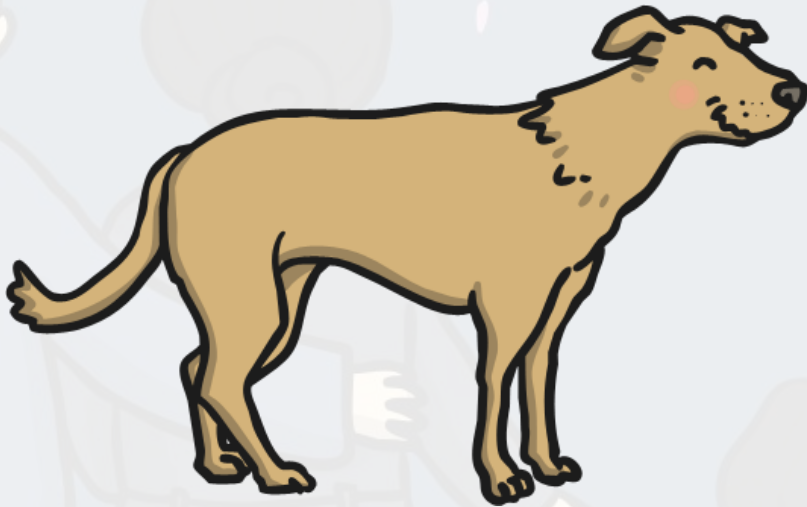
New Year's Day

- The first stop of the day is the temple, to worship Gods and to welcome the New Year.
- Most Chinese families gather together for a New Year banquet. Each family has their own special dish which they prepare for the banquet.



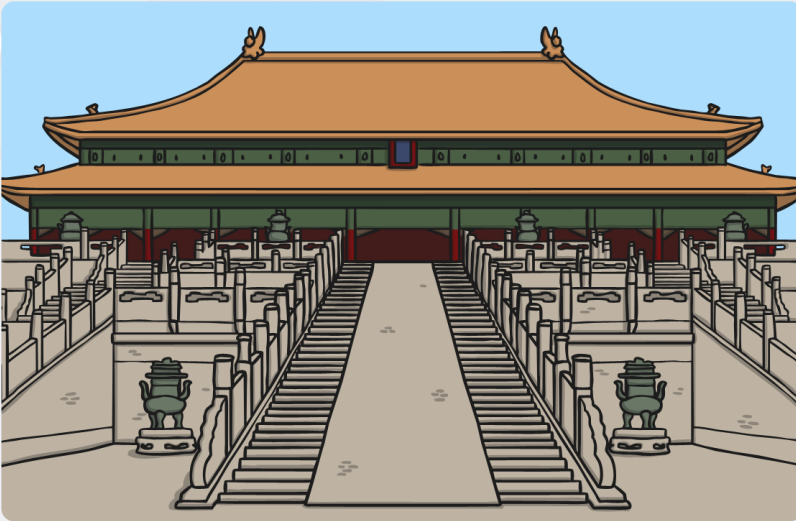
New Year Celebrations

- The New Year Celebrations last for two weeks.
- The 2nd day of the celebrations is also believed to be the birthday of all dogs, so dogs are treated with special foods.

- Dumplings are eaten for good luck
