You will need:

- paper plate
- scissors
- · cotton wool balls
- winter cut-outs
- white glue
- glitter glue (optional)
- sequins (optional)



Instructions

Cut the paper plate in half. Each side can be used to make two igloos.

Turn the paper plate so that the edges are curved up and the flat edge is on the bottom. (It should resemble an igloo shape.)

Use white glue to stick the cotton balls onto the front of the paper plate so that it is covered.

Cut out the door from the cutouts and stick it in the middle of the igloo. Then, choose and cut out your chosen winter characters and stick them next to the door so that they are standing at the front of the igloo.

Use the glitter glue and sequins to add some extra sparkle!
